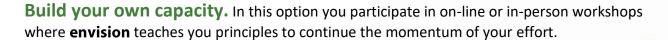
Is it time to inject some new energy into your effort? Would you benefit from fresh momentum for the future? **envision** can assist.

Example projects

Creating an Adaptive Management Plan for Maumee Bay, MI

When one thinks of ecosystem integrity, diversity is a key consideration. **envision** designed and led three sessions with non-governmental organizations and all levels of government to craft plans to maximize biological suitability for both aquatic animals (fish) and terrestrial (birds). The result was the necessary input to create an Adaptive Management Plan for the Bay.¹

Co-benefits for climate justice: Involving diverse Toronto-ians

Transitioning to a carbon-neutral world is a huge job, and retrofitting our existing buildings will be an important activity in this shift. Indeed, retrofitting buildings offers the dual advantage of both helping to reduce greenhouse gases along with providing a great deal of employment. As we move towards a green economy, involving more than those who have historically been involved is essential for both a healthy planet and socially-just society.

In this project, **envision** led a series of facilitated sessions where participants mapped out how they saw reaching their goal of diverse employment in retrofitting buildings (a theory of change). These sessions included identifying the steps that participants believed would be necessary, the precursors to each step and the assumptions around each step. The result was a comprehensive map/ theory of change that guides their work and serves as a framework for evaluating their progress.²
