

Moving past "stuck": Service overview

At some point, working together for greater environmental results nearly guarantees that you'll face challenges. Maybe you've already have had this kind of experience ©? These might include competing priorities, or less than productive group dynamics or meetings, for example. It's unproductive and it's certainly not fun!

Using diverse tools such as "at the wall" thinking, storytelling and slowing down the conversation with intentional listening, **envision** helps you move beyond being "stuck."

Options for working together

Moving past "stuck"

Example project: Identifying audiences served and research priorities for biodiversity science

As part of the Ontario Biodiversity Strategy, the Ontario Government established the Ontario Biodiversity Science Forum to coordinate biodiversity research in the province. After meeting for 18 months, the Forum was at an impasse, struggling with its priorities and who it served.

envision designed and led a participatory workshop with governmental and academic scientists, and non-governmental organizations to address these issues. The session moved successfully from verbal discussion to participatory diagramming. This diagramming enabled the Forum to clarify who it served, and the direction it should be heading.

That pre-work set the stage for further conversation about research across the province. **envision** then designed and facilitated a 100+ person workshop in which participants collectively identified research priorities on biodiversity to support strategy implementation.¹
